Scholarships & Student loans

A very comprehensive website for the majority of Scholarships given out in our region (except for the businesses and groups that award scholarships specifically to Peace River and area residents) can be found at: www.pwsb33.ab.ca under students, click on

The following are places families should investigate for funding of all kinds:

- Parent/Guardian places of Employment/Employment Benefit. Many larger corporations have scholarships for employee's children. Check with the Human Resource office or Union leadership.


They have already had their first performance, cheering on the Pioneers at their home game September 20th.

Mental Health Matters, Every Child Counts!

Grounded in extensive research in youth development, resiliency, and prevention, the **40 Developmental Assets** represent the relationships, opportunities, and personal qualities that young people need in their lives.

Studies have shown consistently that the more assets young people have, the less likely they are to engage in a wide range of high-risk behaviors and the more likely they are to thrive. Assets have power for all young people, regardless of their age, gender, economic status, family, or race/ethnicity.

Providing experiences and opportunities for kids and youth that will instill "positive values, social competencies and a positive identity" promote the 40 Developmental Assets. Building on these internal assets can easily be incorporated into your everyday relationship with your child.

Every Child Counts!!! No matter how old your child is or what grade they are attending (this applies to our teens just as much as it applies to our little ones), here are some helpful ...

...ways you can continue to help your child discover their strengths...

- Adults discover different abilities through experiences in life such as how to balance work and play, build fulfilling relationships and have selfconfidence. Parents can help their children build these strengths by talking about it.
- Encourage your child to discover and get involved in the community. Help them join or volunteer in an organization that they are passionate about. For example, if they love animals, volunteer at the local animal shelter.
- Encourage your child to discover their own school by participating in extra-curricular activities and clubs. This will help them build on their interests, talents and strengths. If the club they want isn't there, help them to initiate a new club!

Encourage your child to discover their own family, and learn how to bring up difficult subject matter. Ask your child who they prefer to talk to about awkward or difficult topics and why. Create a strong support network that encourages openness and trust.

Project PEACE is one of 37 projects in a province-wide Mental Health Capacity Buildings in Schools Intiative. The Initiative is funded by AHS - Addiction and Mental Health, in partnership with Alberta Education and other partners and community agencies. 
Peace High will be working through September and into October to recruit, train and match student peer mentors from all grades to connect with other Peace High students as well as elementary students at Ecolé Springfield School.

Mental Illness Awareness Week is October 6 to 12. Activities to stimulate awareness of mental illness and that promote mental health and wellness will take place throughout the week.


