Peace River High School will continue following our current schedule for classes. Our Bell schedule is posted in the newsletter as well as on our website.

Students will be expected to sign in on time for <u>all</u> classes Core and Electives. Teachers will communicate with the students if there are any exceptions. Students will be marked Online Present, or Online Absent for each class.

Evaluations will continue, so assignments are expected to be completed and handed in on time.

We will be suspending attendance for Mandatory Monday Classes (this includes Grade 9 Health, Learning Strategies, and Mandatory Grade 12 class). We will catch up with those upon the students return. Any outstanding assignments can be completed and handed in during this time. Great time to catch up!

Grade 9's will continue with their supplemental Mandatory Social and Math Classes on Wednesdays and Fridays.

By having accountability through tracked attendance, the students will be able to keep up in their classes and continue their learning process, this will allow a smooth transition back to the classroom in January.

- Stay focused during class.
- Be kind and respectful to others.
- Nod or give a thumbs up to show you understand.
- Mute your microphone unless you are talking
- Wear clothes that would be appropriate for school.
- Pause your video if you have to step away from your computer.

BE RESPONSIBLE



- Pick a quiet spot and let others around you know you are in a meeting.
- Have your materials beside you before the meeting begins. Look around you. Make sure anything on video is something that can be seen by others.
- Do your best to use correct spelling and grammar in the chat box to ask questions and share ideas.
- Have paper and pencil with you in case you need to write things down.
- Ask your teacher for one-on-one help if you don't understand something.
- Use headphones if you have them.
